**CODE OF CONDUCT**

**FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses' welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

## **AHS and EQUINE FLU REGULATIONS**

### **1 African Horse Sickness (AHS)**

African Horse Sickness is a controlled disease in South Africa; therefore, any suspicion of a clinical case of AHS anywhere in the country must be reported to the local State Veterinarian immediately.

Symptoms of AHS include high temperature, rapid breathing, coughing followed by a frothy fluid from the nostrils and death within a few hours. In less acute cases, swelling of the neck and head particularly above the eyes and redness of the mucous membranes.

#### **1 African Horse Sickness Zones**

The Republic of South Africa has been divided into four zones, namely:

- 1 AHS Free Zone
- 2 AHS Surveillance Zone
- 3 AHS Protection Zone
- 4 AHS Infected Zone.

All Equines in South Africa except in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones are required to be vaccinated against AHS annually, with an effective remedy registered in section 1, of Act 101 of 1965.

Equines residing in the AHS Free and AHS Surveillance Zones require permission from the State Directorate for vaccination against AHS.

All equines residing in the AHS Protection and Infected Zones must be vaccinated annually against AHS.

In the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zone vaccination is only allowed between 1st June and 31st October of each year.

Whilst it is not a requirement that horses in the AHS Infected Zone be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st October it has been strongly recommended.

Therefore, the SAEF AHS Vaccination Requirements are as follows:

1 All Equines competing in SAEF events are required to have an annual AHS vaccine with a vaccine registered under Act 101 of 1965. The vaccine consists of AHS 1 and AHS 2. The vaccine has to be administered by a registered Veterinarian, registered with the South African Veterinary Council with a minimum period of 21 days between the two vaccines.

2 The Vaccine and batch number must be written in the appropriate vaccination page and signed and stamped by the Veterinarian administering the vaccine.

- 3 Horses residing in the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zones may only be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st of October each year.
- 4 Horses that reside in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones and participate in events in these Zones only are exempt from the necessity of annual AHS vaccination. However, if they wish to compete in the AHS Protection or AHS Infected Zones, they must be vaccinated.
- 5 AHS vaccinations that are given with an interval of less than the minimum 21 days are null and void for both vaccinations and horses that have received such vaccinations will be deemed not to have been vaccinated.  
No horse may compete for 7 days following any vaccination.

### Equine Influenza (EI)

1. All Horses participating in SAEF Events must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza
2. An initial Primary Course of two vaccinations must be given; the second vaccination must be administered within 21-92 days of the first vaccination.

In completing the primary course of the vaccinations, the vaccine must be the same manufacturer for example you initially vaccinate with Proteq the second must be the same.

3. The First Booster must be given within 7 calendar months following the date of administration of the second vaccination of the primary Course.

All horses that were certified as correctly receiving the Primary Course prior to 1 January 2005 (under previous regulations), are not required to fulfill the requirement for the First Booster, providing there has been no lapse in their vaccination regime.

#### 4. Booster Vaccinations

- a) The minimum booster frequency is every 12 months.
- b) However, for Horses competing, the last Booster must have been given within 6 months +21 days (and not within 7 days) before arrival at the Event.

Horses <b>must</b> have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements for the Primary Course, First Booster and all subsequent boosters.  Horses <b>must</b> have been vaccinated within 6 months +21 days of arriving at the Event however they <b>cannot</b> compete if they have been vaccinated within 7 days of arriving at an event venue.

## **RULES:**

1. Competitors may only ride one horse in each class, except in the Working Classes, where they may ride up to three horses
2. All Riders and Horses must be registered with a Club, SAEF and SASA, except for those entered in classes F8 & F9 or must pay a Temporary SASA membership of R80 with their entry fees. Temporary SASA membership will not earn Grading or Victor Ludorum Points. Membership forms may be obtained on the SASA website [www.showingsa.co.za](http://www.showingsa.co.za) or from [admin@showingsa.co.za](mailto:admin@showingsa.co.za). SAEF Day Membership fee R150. Once a rider has done more than two shows, then the rider must register online and become a full SAEF member.  
SASA will pay entry fees for SASA EDTS competitors in all classes. That includes In Hand and Under Saddle classes. The competitor must be an EDTS member of SASA. Membership is free. EDTS application forms, Rules and Conditions are available at [www.showingsa.co.za](http://www.showingsa.co.za) or from [admin@showingsa.co.za](mailto:admin@showingsa.co.za) EDTS competitors will earn EDTS Victor Ludorum points.
3. Working Hunters will be required to jump a course of approximately 6-8 fences, one of which will be a combination.
4. Should a competitor qualify more than one horse for the championship, he may nominate another rider, who must be a paid-up member of SASA, to show the horse in that championship. However, the competitor must do the individual test required in the Championship.
5. The Organising Committee, in consultation with the SASA Representative, reserves the right to cancel or combine classes.
6. All classes will be run under SASA Rules - 20<sup>th</sup> Edition (Effective 1<sup>st</sup> July 2019).
7. EVERY COMPETITOR ENTERING THIS SHOW DOES HEREBY INDEMNIFY ANY JUDGE REGISTERED WITH SASA, OFFICIATING AT THIS SHOW, AGAINST ANY CLAIM OF ANY NATURE FROM ANY CAUSE WHATSOEVER.

**RULES:**

1. A horse/pony eliminated from one test may not be placed higher than competitors completing all 5 tests. Competitors eliminated in any one test will score "0" for that test, but are not eliminated from the competition.
2. To equalise the influence of the dressage phase (Test 4), a multiplying factor will be applied to the dressage score.
3. If there are not sufficient entries in this section, the class will be cancelled
4. Tack as per showing or working horse classes may be used
5. Any competitor who qualifies for the free test may only scratch on presentation of a medical or veterinary certificate.
6. All Classes will be run under SASA Rules – 20<sup>th</sup> Edition (effective 1<sup>st</sup> July 2019)
7. EVERY COMPETITOR ENTERING THIS SHOW DOES HEREBY INDEMNIFY ANY JUDGE REGISTERED WITH SASA, OFFICIATING AT THIS SHOW, AGAINST ANY CLAIM OF ANY NATURE FROM ANY CAUSE WHATSOEVER.

**TESTS:**

1. Conformation, Movement (walk and trot) and Turnout.
2. Ride by Judge.( Juniors and Adults Only)
3. Obedience and Versatility (a working riding horse type of test).
4. Dressage (specially written test).

**THIS PHASE IS RESTRICTED TO THE BEST QUALIFIED PONIES IN TESTS 1 AND 3 FOR PONY RIDERS AND HORSES IN TESTS 1,2, & 3 FOR JUNIORS AND ADULTS. THE NUMBER OF QUALIFIERS WILL BE ARRIVED AT BY TAKING 30% OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF HORSES ENTERED, ADJUSTED TO THE NEAREST WHOLE NUMBER, OR 15 HORSES, WHICHEVER IS GREATER.**

**5. Jumping (Restricted to qualifiers from Test 4):**

A course of Approximately 8 – 10 fences of Approx. 0.80m for Pony Riders & 0.90m for Juniors & Adults.

a. 2 Faults for each knock or refusal will be deducted from 15 with a worst possible score of 0. 3 refusals will result in elimination from this phase.

b. Points out of 15 for the style of jumping in respect of the horse only.

**6. Free Test:**

Open to the best five horses/ponies overall in Tests 1 to 5 . Each of the five will be given three minutes to set up and two minutes to show off the best aspects of his horse/pony in the Derby Arena. This may include one or more jumps if the rider so desires. Competitors may use the fixed fences excluding the Derby Bank & the water jump provided prior arrangement has been made with Course Builder.

No fire may be used, safety of the horse and rider in the free test is paramount.  
 Rider of horse/pony must be in control of the horse/pony always. Failure to comply with the above will entail elimination.

**CLASSIFICATION:** The winner of the class, who must compete in all tests, will be the horse/pony with the highest overall score, totalled from the 6 tests. In the event of a tie the best score in Test 6 will be the deciding factor. Should there still be a tie then the best score in Test 1, 2 and 3 for Adults and Juniors and Tests 1 and 3 for Pony Riders, will be the deciding score.
