CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses' welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

Bought and Sold Entries will be allowed as long as the correct documentation is submitted within the correct time frames and the original rider has signed the form.
There will be no buying and selling of entries after 10th of December 2020. Forms received thereafter will not be accepted.

REFUNDS: No Refunds will be given after closing date of entries. Entries withdrawn before close of date will be refunded less Payfast fees. However due to inclement weather conditions or other unforeseen circumstances, should it necessitate cancelling the show, 80% of the entry fee will be refunded.

TEMP. MEMBERSHIP: There will be a temporary membership arena fee of R150 for competitors not a member of Kyalami Park Club. This is to be paid once per rider. If Entering Jumping please pay the temp membership with your jumping entries and then when entering the equitation, you may declare that you are a member as you would have paid the temp membership already

PRIZEMONEY: A minimum of 60% net of entry fees less levies and VAT for open classes plus sponsorship and 40% less levies and VAT Novice and Intermediate classes plus sponsorship per class. This excludes sponsorship money that will be independently allocated by the OC.

SUBSTITUTIONS: A substitution is a change of EITHER a horse or rider and should be done no later than 30minutes before the start of the class

DRESS: Jackets Only

STABLING: Stabling will be available at **R200 per day/night OR R1100 for the duration of the show (14 – 21 December)**. Stabling is limited and will be booked on a first come first serve basis, should you require to be stabled together with another rider please send the booking forms together as stabling is allocated immediately upon receipt. Initial bedding will be provided. **PLEASE NOTE THAT YOU MAY NOT ARRIVE BEFORE THE DATE YOU STIPULATED ON YOUR BOOKING FORM AS ARRIVAL DATE.**

NO PADDOCKS WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE VENUE

ALL COMPETITORS needing stabling MUST COMPLETE the Stable booking form and submit the booking prior to arriving at the show

Initial Bedding will be provided, additional bedding will be available to purchase at R30 per bag.

Competitors entering an Equitation class do so on the understanding that their horse must be available should it be required by the judges or organising committee for a draw or a mystery horse for other competitors to ride

The allocation of stabling accommodation is carried out by the Show Director and under no circumstances may any competitor change his/her stabling accommodation or alter the stabling list without prior consultation with, and approval of, the Show director.

Failure to comply could involve disqualification of the horse concerned.

Stables will be allocated to out of Province rider first, on a first come first paid basis.

Competitors wishing to be stabled with others should indicate this on their stable booking form, however please bear in mind that if the person you are wanting to be stabled with has booked early and you have booked late or vice versa this allocation may not be possible as stables are allocated strictly on a first booked and paid for basis.

The grooms are encouraged to hand walk horses.

GALA EVENING: DUE TO COVID-19 REGULATIONS THE GALA EVENING WILL NOT TAKE PLACE

ACCESS: **Free Access. PLEASE NO SPECTATORS OR INVITED GUESTS AS PER COVID-19 REGULATIONS**
All horseboxes and floats must be parked in the allocated area provided.

ACCESS: **ACCESS THROUGH THE MAIN KPC GATE:** All horseboxes and floats must be parked in the allocated area provided.

PASSPORTS: All horses must be in possession of their FEI Passports or Group IX Passports at all shows. Inspections, sampling and random passport checks, may take place at any event.

AHS and EQUINE FLU REGULATIONS

1 African Horse Sickness (AHS)

African Horse Sickness is a controlled disease in South Africa; therefore, any suspicion of a clinical case of AHS anywhere in the country must be reported to the local State Veterinarian immediately.

Symptoms of AHS include high temperature, rapid breathing, coughing followed by a frothy fluid from the nostrils and death within a few hours. In less acute cases, swelling of the neck and head particularly above the eyes and redness of the mucous membranes.

1 African Horse Sickness Zones

The Republic of South Africa has been divided into four zones, namely:

- 1 AHS Free Zone
- 2 AHS Surveillance Zone
- 3 AHS Protection Zone
- 4 AHS Infected Zone.

All Equines in South Africa except in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones are required to be vaccinated against AHS annually, with an effective remedy registered in section 1, of Act 101 of 1965.

Equines residing in the AHS Free and AHS Surveillance Zones require permission from the State Directorate for vaccination against AHS.

All equines residing in the AHS Protection and Infected Zones must be vaccinated annually against AHS.

In the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zone vaccination is only allowed between 1st June and 31st October of each year.

Whilst it is not a requirement that horses in the AHS Infected Zone be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st October it has been strongly recommended.

Therefore, the SAEF AHS Vaccination Requirements are as follows:

- 1 All Equines competing in SAEF events are required to have an annual AHS vaccine with a vaccine registered under Act 101 of 1965. The vaccine consists of AHS 1 and AHS 2. The vaccine has to be administered by a registered Veterinarian, registered with the South African Veterinary Council with a minimum period of 21 days between the two vaccines.
- 2 The Vaccine and batch number must be written in the appropriate vaccination page and signed and stamped by the Veterinarian administering the vaccine.
- 3 Horses residing in the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zones may only be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st of October each year.
- 4 Horses that reside in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones and participate in events in these Zones only are exempt from the necessity of annual AHS vaccination. However, if they wish to compete in the AHS Protection or AHS Infected Zones, they must be vaccinated.

5 AHS vaccinations that are given with an interval of less than the minimum 21 days are null and void for both vaccinations and horses that have received such vaccinations will be deemed not to have been vaccinated.
No horse may compete for 7 days following any vaccination.

Equine Influenza (EI)

1. All Horses participating in SAEF Events must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza
2. An initial Primary Course of two vaccinations must be given; the second vaccination must be administered within 21-92 days of the first vaccination.

In completing the primary course of the vaccinations, the vaccine must be the same manufacturer for example you initially vaccinate with Proteq the second must be the same.

3. The First Booster must be given within 7 calendar months following the date of administration of the second vaccination of the primary Course.

All horses that were certified as correctly receiving the Primary Course prior to 1 January 2005 (under previous regulations), are not required to fulfill the requirement for the First Booster, providing there has been no lapse in their vaccination regime.

4. Booster Vaccinations

- a) The minimum booster frequency is every 12 months.
- b) However, for Horses competing, the last Booster must have been given within 6 months +21 days (and not within 7 days) before arrival at the Event.

MEDICATION CONTROL:

MCP testing as per SAEF Regulations will be done by the appointed Testing Vet.
Laboratory: National Horse Racing Authority, Turffontein Racecourse, Turf Club Street.

PROTESTS & APPEALS:

As per General Regulations. All protests and Objections must be done in writing within the required timelines and in receipt of a R750 deposit.

Team Entries:

DUE TO COVID-19 IMPACT & RESTRICTIONS ALL 2020 TEAM EVENTS HAVE BEEN CANCELLED

This show will be run under COVID-19 regulations

1. All riders, officials, staff, support staff and medics agree and confirm to comply with the SA Government and SAEF Covid-19 guidelines and protocols as set out on the SAEF website www.saef.org.za when entering a show/event.
2. A rider may only be accompanied by the driver trucking the horse and a groom. Where the rider is trucking the horse themselves, then only the groom may accompany the rider. Where necessary additional groom/s to attended horse/s. In the case of underage riders, they may be accompanied by a maximum of plus 2 (i.e. Parent, Coach, Owner)
3. All attendees will be obliged to report to the COVID 19 Officer/employee, upon entry of the premises to sign the register, sanitise their hands, and have their temperature taken and recorded. The name of the Compliance Officer will be indicated on the schedule. Show holding bodies to get clearance and permission from the Compliance Officer to add their contact number to the schedule as well.
4. It is compulsory for all attendees to wear masks on the property at all times and adhere to social distancing protocols.
5. Prize Money will be done by Electronic EFT.
6. Although the Show holding Body has taken all necessary precautions to ensure compliance to Covid-19 protocols and guidelines as stipulated by the Department of Health, it is important to note that neither the Show holding Body, SASJ, nor SAEF can be held responsible for any person contracting COVID-19 at the said venue. All attendees are entering the venue at their own risk.
7. Should any attendee at the show contravene any of the Covid-19 regulations, then he/she will be asked by the Covid-19 Compliance Officer to leave the venue immediately. There will be no refunds for show entries.
8. Riders may warm-up and compete without a mask.

Equitation Rules & Regulations:

1. All classes will be run under SAEQA Equitation Rules & Regulations as per SAEQA Equitation Rules 3rd Edition revised 1st November 2018.
2. Copies of the Tests to be ridden will be circulated to the respective Provincial Discipline Chairman and published on the respective Provincial & SAEQA websites at closing date of entries.
3. Entry Fees are not refundable. The Vest Deposit of R50 is refundable up to the last day of the show.
4. Open individual championships will take precedence over normal Jumping classes and competitors will not be excused once the class has started

Special Dispensation

SAEQA are delighted to offer Equitation classes at the South African Youth Championships from the 15th to the 20th December 2020.

As there have been very few equitation shows due to the restrictions of Covid, SAEQA is offering some dispensations to allow riders who have not been able to get points this year, to be able to compete. Please note all riders need to be registered with SAEQA for 2020 before close of entries.

1. Riders do not need the required points as long as they have ridden in the grade they wish to compete in, in the last 24 months.
2. Riders that have ridden in a particular grade in a SANESA competition this year may compete in that grade at SA Youth Championships.
3. **The horse / pony that the rider intends to enter to participate in the relevant class must have competed at that height in the past 24 months.**

Please note that the PR and Junior Open Championships will only run if there is a minimum of 12 riders in each class (**age category**).

A special Dispensation has been granted by the National Equitation Committee and Rule 4.5.3 a. which reads as follows:

These Championships are open to athletes who have obtained 4 grading points in Open Equitation competitions in their relevant age category in the time period after the last day of the relevant SA Championship event until the closing date of entries for the next upcoming relevant SA Championship event.

Will not be enforced, however, competitors entering these Open Equitation Classes will have to have ridden in an Open Equitation Class during the past 24 months up to the closing date of entries. They will also have to comply with Appendix E - Grading Points, where it states under Point 4, that the horse/pony they wish to compete on has successfully competed in events in the equivalent height category in either Eventing/Show Jumping/SANESA (Proof of Evidence is required).
