<b>Age Classification of Riders</b>	<p>A horse or pony and rider combination may only ride in one Section:</p> <p><b>Pony Rider:</b> Athletes who may take part in Competitions for Pony Riders until the end of the year they reach the age of sixteen (16) riding Ponies</p> <p><b>Children:</b> Athletes may take part in Children's' Competitions until the end of the year they reach the age of fourteen (14) riding Horses</p> <p><b>Junior:</b> Athletes may take part in Competitions for Juniors from the year they reach the age of fourteen (14) until the end of the year they reach the age of eighteen (18).</p> <p><b>Young Rider:</b> Athletes who may take part in Competitions for Young Riders from the beginning of the year they reach the age of sixteen (16) until the end of the year they reach the age of twenty-one (21).</p>
<b>Horse Inspection</b>	Horses/Ponies entered in the Prix St George classes must be presented for an inspection. Please bring Horse passports to the inspection.
<b>Prizes Money</b>	Minimum 40% of entry fees, excluding levies payable, plus Sponsorship.
<b>Championship Classes</b>	<p>If a SA Championship is won by a competitor who is the only entrant for that championship, he/she must attain a minimum score of 60% to be awarded, the SA Champion title for that grade.</p> <p>Where numbers permit, the top 15 horses will qualify to ride in the Championship.</p> <p>The Championship and Freestyle classes in each section are to be ridden from memory and without whips except for the PR / Child Prelim classes.</p>

<b>No. of Tests per Day</b>	No horse / Pony may compete in more than 2 tests per day up to and including Elementary-Medium level. Horses / Ponies may only compete in one test per day at DSA Medium level and above.
<b>Registered Grade</b>	<p><b>A horse / Pony may ONLY compete in the grade in which it is registered.</b></p> <p>A horse that is registered in the Big or Medium Tour grades may ride down to any lower Tour grade.</p>
<b>Variation of Programme</b>	The advertised programme and classes will be adhered to as far as possible. However, in the light of unforeseen circumstances the Organising Committee reserves the right to cancel, combine, divide or postpone any class providing such alteration is within the framework of Rules. No refunds after closing date of entries.
<b>Riding Times</b>	<p>Once riders with more than one horse have been timetabled, a random draw will establish the order of riding.</p> <p>Times will be posted on KPC website and DSA website. The onus is on the competitor to check the final starting order before the start of the class at the arena that the classes are to be held.</p> <p><b>Any clashes with a rider competing in another discipline must be brought to the attention of the dressage organiser well before the start of the class.</b></p>
<b>Prize Giving Ceremonies</b>	All Prize winners are obliged to attend prize giving correctly dressed. PRIZE GIVING IS COMPULSORY. If you do not attend prize giving you may forfeit your prize money and any gifts for donations from sponsors may be reallocated. The show holder will not be responsible for keeping your prizes for you or getting your prizes and gifts to you.
<b>Bridle Numbers</b>	Will be allocated and this number must be attached to the LEFT-HAND SIDE of the halter/head collar and/or to the numnah/Bridle.
<b>Rules &amp; Regulations</b>	The event will be run under DSA rules April 2020 & As per SAEF General Regulations 14 May 2019 unless otherwise stated. FEI rules and including the SAEF Veterinary Regulations & Directives. The Gauteng Championship / Consolation in each category may only be awarded to bona fide Gauteng Riders as stipulated by the Gauteng Sports Confederation.
<b>Callers &amp; Whips</b>	All Warm-Up and Qualifying classes may use a whip and a caller. All Championship / Consolation classes will be ridden from <b>memory and without whips. Except for the PR / Child Prelim classes.</b>
<b>Freestyle Music</b>	This must be supplied in MP3 Format to <a href="mailto:dressage@kyalamiparkclub.co.za">dressage@kyalamiparkclub.co.za</a> by no later than 16h00 on the 8 <sup>th</sup> of December 2020. The <b>onus is on the rider</b> to ensure that he/she has checked his/her music with the sound engineer.
<b>Passports</b>	All competitors must have their up-to-date horse passports at the event for inspection at any time. Horses whose passports do not fully comply with the current Government, FEI, DSA and General regulations may be refused permission to compete and asked to leave the venue. <b>Passports must be handed into the Show Office on arrival, prior to competing.</b>
<b>African Horse Sickness &amp; Equine Flu</b>	All horses must be vaccinated with AHS vaccine and with Equine Influenza and in accordance with the regulations laid out in the equestrian rules. Horses that do not comply may be refused permission to compete and can be asked to leave the show grounds.
<b>Testing &amp; Checking</b>	Both horses and athletes may be tested at any time during the show for prohibited substances. Saddlery and bits may be checked before and/or after competitors enter/leave the arena.
<b>Substitutions</b>	As per DSA rules. Substitutions may not take place after the first day of the show.

<b>Objections &amp; Appeals</b>	As per SAEF General Regulations 14 May 2019, all Objections and Appeals must be lodged with the Show Director or Show Secretary in writing within the specified time and accompanied by the required deposit. See Appendix A.
<b>Schooling of Horses</b>	Under no account, and under penalty of disqualification, may any horse, except those ridden by Para Dressage athletes (where allowed), take part in any class should that horse have been schooled under saddle by anyone other than the competitor concerned from the start of the 1st day of the show until the end of that horse's last class.
<b>Saddlery &amp; Dress</b>	The event will be run under current DSA Rules April 2020 and DSA General Regulations unless otherwise stated.
<b>Conduct</b>	Any owner or rider who attempts to interfere with or influence judges, officials or stewards, or who at any time on the show grounds uses any contemptuous or abusive language to any of the judges, officials or stewards will forfeit his/her rights to any prizes to which they might otherwise be entitled and will receive a yellow card which will require them to remove themselves and their horse from the grounds pending a disciplinary enquiry.
<b>Indemnity Responsibility</b>	All persons participating at this event do so at their own risk and will have no claim against Kyalami Park Club (KPC), South African Equestrian Federation (SAEF), DSA (Dressage South Africa including any officials, employees, members, affiliated bodies, show-holding bodies or sponsors of KPC, DSA or SAEF, for any damage or loss of property or death or injury of persons suffered during or in connection with this event from any cause whatsoever. ## AHS and EQUINE FLU REGULATIONS

### 1 African Horse Sickness (AHS)

African Horse Sickness is a controlled disease in South Africa; therefore, any suspicion of a clinical case of AHS anywhere in the country must be reported to the local State Veterinarian immediately.

Symptoms of AHS include high temperature, rapid breathing, coughing followed by a frothy fluid from the nostrils and death within a few hours. In less acute cases, swelling of the neck and head particularly above the eyes and redness of the mucous membranes.

#### 1 African Horse Sickness Zones

The Republic of South Africa has been divided into four zones, namely:

- 1 AHS Free Zone
- 2 AHS Surveillance Zone
- 3 AHS Protection Zone
- 4 AHS Infected Zone.

All Equines in South Africa except in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones are required to be vaccinated against AHS annually, with an effective remedy registered in section 1, of Act 101 of 1965.

Equines residing in the AHS Free and AHS Surveillance Zones require permission from the State Directorate for vaccination against AHS.

All equines residing in the AHS Protection and Infected Zones must be vaccinated annually against AHS.

In the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zone vaccination is only allowed between 1st June and 31st October of each year.

Whilst it is not a requirement that horses in the AHS Infected Zone be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st October it has been strongly recommended.

Therefore, the SAEF AHS Vaccination Requirements are as follows:

- 1 All Equines competing in SAEF events are required to have an annual AHS vaccine with a vaccine registered under Act 101 of 1965. The vaccine consists of AHS 1 and AHS 2. The vaccine has to be administered by a registered Veterinarian, registered with the South African Veterinary Council with a minimum period of 21 days between the two vaccines.
- 2 The Vaccine and batch number must be written in the appropriate vaccination page and signed and stamped by the Veterinarian administering the vaccine.
- 3 Horses residing in the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zones may only be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st of October each year.
- 4 Horses that reside in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones and participate in events in these Zones only are exempt from the necessity of annual AHS vaccination. However, if they wish to compete in the AHS Protection or AHS Infected Zones, they must be vaccinated.
- 5 AHS vaccinations that are given with an interval of less than the minimum 21 days are null and void for both vaccinations and horses that have received such vaccinations will be deemed not to have been vaccinated.

No horse may compete for 7 days following any vaccination.

### Equine Influenza (EI)

1. All Horses participating in SAEF Events must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza
2. An initial Primary Course of two vaccinations must be given; the second vaccination must be administered within 21-92 days of the first vaccination.

In completing the primary course of the vaccinations, the vaccine must be the same manufacturer for example you initially vaccinate with Proteq the second must be the same.

3. The First Booster must be given within 7 calendar months following the date of administration of the second vaccination of the primary Course.

All horses that were certified as correctly receiving the Primary Course prior to 1 January 2005 (under previous regulations), are not required to fulfill the requirement for the First Booster, providing there has been no lapse in their vaccination regime.

#### 4. Booster Vaccinations

- a) The minimum booster frequency is every 12 months.
- b) However, for horses competing, the last Booster must have been given within 6 months + 21 days (and not within 7 days) before arrival at the Event.

## APPENDIX A: OBJECTIONS AND APPEALS

Since there are ambiguities in the rules, the following has been specifically prepared to be the protocols and procedures which will be in effect should one wish to have a decision reviewed, report an incident or complain about a perceived injustice at the show.  
These procedures are definitive for this show and supersede all others. All decisions will be binding.

<b>THE GROUND JURY</b>	<p>The principal duty of the Ground Jury is the technical judging of all competitions and the determination of their final results. It is up to the Ground Jury to solve all the problems that could arise under its jurisdiction. The Ground Jury is responsible for all aspects of the Field of Play. It is responsible for any problems of the going, the judging, the rules, the results and any other aspects that affect the competition as such.</p> <p>The Judge at C in all other arenas will be the President of that Ground Jury. The other judges in that arena will form the rest of that Ground Jury.</p>
<b>TO OBJECT TO OR PROTEST AGAINST ANY ISSUE UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE GROUND JURY, THE COMPLAINANT MUST:</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Fill in and sign the <b>Protest Form for the Ground Jury</b> (GJP Form) and should there be too little space, additional information may be attached to this form. Video evidence and statements of witnesses may also be included. This should be lodged with the OC or the DSA Representative</li> <li>2. A deposit of <b>R750</b> must be lodged with the OC or the DSA Representative at the time of protest for which a numbered receipt must be issued.</li> <li>3. The protest must be lodged immediately where appropriate, or at least within <b>30 minutes</b> after the final results of the class have been published. It is at the sole discretion of the President of the Ground Jury to accept/reject a protest outside of the 30 minutes after the results have been published.</li> <li>4. The OC and/or the DSA Representative will facilitate the meeting of the Members of the Ground Jury concerned, for their deliberation.</li> <li>5. The OC and/or the DSA Representative will notify the Complainant of the outcome of the Protest. Should the protest be upheld, the OC or the DSA Representative will refund the deposit to the Complainant but should the protest be denied, the deposit will be forfeited in favour of DSA.</li> <li>6. Should the Complainant be dissatisfied with the outcome of the protest, an Appeal may be lodged.</li> </ol>
<b>PROTESTS TO THE DSA REPRESENTATIVE AND THE ORGANISING COMMITTEE</b>	<p>A complainant who wishes to protest a matter outside of the jurisdiction of the Ground Jury should do so to the DSA Representative and /or the OC. These will be matters of a general nature, not directly affecting the competition such as: complaints about rider registration or eligibility, bad behaviour, non-competitors riding horses, stabling issues etc.</p>
<b>TO OBJECT TO OR PROTEST AGAINST GENERAL MATTERS THE COMPLAINANT MUST:</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Fill in and sign the <b>Ordinary Protest Form</b> (OP Form) and should there be too little space, additional information may be attached to this form. Video evidence and statements of witnesses may also be included. This should be lodged with the OC or the DSA Representative</li> <li>2. A deposit of <b>R750</b> must be lodged with the OC or the DSA Representative.</li> <li>3. The protest must be lodged immediately where appropriate, or at least within <b>30 minutes after the last prize-giving of the show</b>. It is at the sole discretion of the OC to accept or reject a protest outside of this timeframe.</li> <li>4. The OC will meet with the DSA Representative, the Chief Steward and the Athletes' Representative where appropriate and make a judgment.</li> <li>5. The OC and/or the DSA Representative will notify the Complainant of the outcome of the Protest. Should the protest be upheld, the OC or the DSA Representative will refund the deposit to the Complainant but should the protest be denied, the deposit will be forfeited in favour of DSA.</li> <li>6. Should the Complainant be dissatisfied with the outcome of the protest, an Appeal may be lodged.</li> </ol>
<b>APPEALS</b>	<p>Should a protest go against the Complainant, the Complainant may lodge an Appeal with the Appeals Committee. The Appeals Committee consists of a President and 2 members who are not officials in any other capacity during the Event.</p>
<b>TO LODGE AN APPEAL THE COMPLAINANT MUST:</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Fill in and sign the <b>Appeal Form</b> (AF Form) and should there be too little space, additional information may be attached to this form. Video evidence and statements of witnesses may also be included. This should be lodged with the OC or the DSA Representative</li> <li>2. A deposit of <b>R1000</b> must be lodged with the OC or the DSA Representative at the time of the Appeal for which a numbered receipt must be issued.</li> <li>3. The Appeal must be lodged within <b>30 minutes</b> of the Complainant being informed of the unsuccessful protest. It is at the sole discretion of the President of the Appeals Committee to accept/reject an Appeal outside of the 30 minutes after the results have been published.</li> <li>4. The OC or the DSA Representative will facilitate the meeting of the Members of the Appeals Committee for their deliberation.</li> <li>5. The OC or the DSA Representative will notify the Complainant of the outcome of the Appeal. Should the Appeal be upheld, the OC or the DSA Representative will refund the deposit to the Complainant but should the Appeal be denied, the deposit will be forfeited in favour of DSA. The decision of the Appeals Committee is final.</li> </ol>
