## **CODE OF CONDUCT**

### **FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses' welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

***There will be no buying and selling of entries after 10<sup>th</sup> of December 2020. Forms received thereafter will not be accepted.***

**REFUNDS:** No Refunds will be given after closing date of entries. Entries withdrawn before close of date will be refunded less Payfast fees. However due to inclement weather conditions or other unforeseen circumstances, should it necessitate cancelling the show, 80% of the entry fee will be refunded.

**Bank Details:** All entries to be paid for online via Payfast. Unpaid entries will not save on the system

**ENTRY FEE:** R450 per Class (incl. R64.98 KPC Arena Levy, R4.50 EDTS Levy, R37.50 SASA Levy, R50 Officials fee, R23.65 Paramedics/Security)

**Plus, R50 refundable Number Deposit per horse**

**TEMP. MEMBERSHIP:** There will be a temporary membership arena fee of R150 for competitors not a member of Kyalami Park Club. This is to be paid once per rider. If Entering Jumping please pay the temp membership with your jumping entries and then when entering the showing, you may declare that you are a member as you would have paid the temp membership already

**PRIZEMONEY:** A minimum of 60% net of entry fees less levies and VAT for open classes plus sponsorship and 40% less levies and VAT Novice and Intermediate classes plus sponsorship per class. This excludes sponsorship money that will be independently allocated by the OC.

**SUBSTITUTIONS:** A substitution is a change of EITHER a horse or rider and should be done no later than 30minutes before the start of the class

**DRESS:** Jackets Only

**STABLING:** Stabling will be available at **R200 per day/night OR R1100 for the duration of the show (14 – 21 December)**. Stabling is limited and will be booked on a first come first serve basis, should you require to be stabled together with another rider please send the booking forms together as stabling is allocated immediately upon receipt. Initial bedding will be provided. **PLEASE NOTE THAT YOU MAY NOT ARRIVE BEFORE THE DATE YOU STIPULATED ON YOUR BOOKING FORM AS ARRIVAL DATE.**

**NO PADDOCKS WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE VENUE**

ALL COMPETITORS needing stabling MUST COMPLETE the Stable booking form and submit the booking prior to arriving at the show

Initial Bedding will be provided, additional bedding will be available to purchase at R30 per bag.

The allocation of stabling accommodation is carried out by the Show Director and under no circumstances may any competitor change his/her stabling accommodation or alter the stabling list without prior consultation with, and approval of, the Show director.

Failure to comply could involve disqualification of the horse concerned.

Stables will be allocated to out of Province rider first, on a first come first paid basis.

Competitors wishing to be stabled with others should indicate this on their stable booking form, however please bear in mind that if the person you are wanting to be stabled with has booked early and you have booked late or vice versa this allocation may not be possible as stables are allocated strictly on a first booked and paid for basis.

The grooms are encouraged to hand walk horses.

**GALA EVENING:** DUE TO COVID-19 REGULATIONS THE GALA EVENING WILL NOT TAKE PLACE

**ACCESS:** **Free Access. PLEASE NO SPECTATORS OR INVITED GUESTS AS PER COVID-19 REGULATIONS**  
All horseboxes and floats must be parked in the allocated area provided.

**ACCESS:** **ACCESS THROUGH THE MAIN KPC GATE:** All horseboxes and floats must be parked in the allocated area provided.

**PASSPORTS:** All horses must be in possession of their FEI Passports or Group IX Passports at all shows. Inspections, sampling and random passport checks, may take place at any event.

## **AHS and EQUINE FLU REGULATIONS**

### **1 African Horse Sickness (AHS)**

African Horse Sickness is a controlled disease in South Africa; therefore, any suspicion of a clinical case of AHS anywhere in the country must be reported to the local State Veterinarian immediately.

Symptoms of AHS include high temperature, rapid breathing, coughing followed by a frothy fluid from the nostrils and death within a few hours. In less acute cases, swelling of the neck and head particularly above the eyes and redness of the mucous membranes.

#### **1 African Horse Sickness Zones**

The Republic of South Africa has been divided into four zones, namely:

- 1 AHS Free Zone
- 2 AHS Surveillance Zone
- 3 AHS Protection Zone
- 4 AHS Infected Zone.

All Equines in South Africa except in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones are required to be vaccinated against AHS annually, with an effective remedy registered in section 1, of Act 101 of 1965.

Equines residing in the AHS Free and AHS Surveillance Zones require permission from the State Directorate for vaccination against AHS.

All equines residing in the AHS Protection and Infected Zones must be vaccinated annually against AHS.

In the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zone vaccination is only allowed between 1st June and 31st October of each year.

Whilst it is not a requirement that horses in the AHS Infected Zone be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st October it has been strongly recommended.

Therefore, the SAEF AHS Vaccination Requirements are as follows:

- 1 All Equines competing in SAEF events are required to have an annual AHS vaccine with a vaccine registered under Act 101 of 1965. The vaccine consists of AHS 1 and AHS 2. The vaccine has to be administered by a registered Veterinarian, registered with the South African Veterinary Council with a minimum period of 21 days between the two vaccines.
- 2 The Vaccine and batch number must be written in the appropriate vaccination page and signed and stamped by the Veterinarian administering the vaccine.
- 3 Horses residing in the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zones may only be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st of October each year.
- 4 Horses that reside in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones and participate in events in these Zones only are exempt from the necessity of annual AHS vaccination. However, if they wish to compete in the AHS Protection or AHS Infected Zones, they must be vaccinated.
- 5 AHS vaccinations that are given with an interval of less than the minimum 21 days are null and void for both vaccinations and horses that have received such vaccinations will be deemed not to have been vaccinated.

No horse may compete for 7 days following any vaccination.

### **Equine Influenza (EI)**

1. All Horses participating in SAEF Events must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza
2. An initial Primary Course of two vaccinations must be given; the second vaccination must be administered within 21-92 days of the first vaccination.

In completing the primary course of the vaccinations, the vaccine must be the same manufacturer for example you initially vaccinate with Proteq the second must be the same.

3. The First Booster must be given within 7 calendar months following the date of administration of the second vaccination of the primary Course.

All horses that were certified as correctly receiving the Primary Course prior to 1 January 2005 (under previous regulations), are not required to fulfill the requirement for the First Booster, providing there has been no lapse in their vaccination regime.

#### 4. Booster Vaccinations

a) The minimum booster frequency is every 12 months.

b) However, for Horses competing, the last Booster must have been given within 6 months +21 days (and not within 7 days) before arrival at the Event.

### MEDICATION CONTROL:

MCP testing as per SAEF Regulations will be done by the appointed Testing Vet.  
Laboratory: National Horse Racing Authority, Turffontein Racecourse, Turf Club Street.

#### **PROTESTS & APPEALS:**

As per General Regulations. All protests and Objections must be done in writing within the required timelines and in receipt of a R750 deposit.

#### **Team Entries:**

DUE TO COVID-19 IMPACT & RESTRICTIONS ALL 2020 TEAM EVENTS HAVE BEEN CANCELLED

#### **This show will be run under COVID-19 regulations**

1. All riders, officials, staff, support staff and medics agree and confirm to comply with the SA Government and SAEF Covid-19 guidelines and protocols as set out on the SAEF website [www.saeef.org.za](http://www.saeef.org.za) when entering a show/event.
2. A rider may only be accompanied by the driver trucking the horse and a groom. Where the rider is trucking the horse themselves, then only the groom may accompany the rider. Where necessary additional groom/s to attended horse/s. In the case of underage riders, they may be accompanied by a maximum of plus 2 (i.e. Parent, Coach, Owner)
3. All attendees will be obliged to report to the COVID 19 Officer/employee, upon entry of the premises to sign the register, sanitise their hands, and have their temperature taken and recorded. The name of the Compliance Officer will be indicated on the schedule. Show holding bodies to get clearance and permission from the Compliance Officer to add their contact number to the schedule as well.
4. It is compulsory for all attendees to wear masks on the property at all times and adhere to social distancing protocols.
5. Prize Money will be done by Electronic EFT.
6. Although the Show holding Body has taken all necessary precautions to ensure compliance to Covid-19 protocols and guidelines as stipulated by the Department of Health, it is important to note that neither the Show holding Body, SASJ, nor SAEF can be held responsible for any person contracting COVID-19 at the said venue. All attendees are entering the venue at their own risk.
7. Should any attendee at the show contravene any of the Covid-19 regulations, then he/she will be asked by the Covid-19 Compliance Officer to leave the venue immediately. There will be no refunds for show entries.
8. Riders may warm-up and compete without a mask.

#### **SHOWING RULES:**

1. Competitors may only ride one horse in each class, except in the Working Classes, where they may ride up to three horses
2. All Riders and Horses must be registered with a Club, SAEF and SASA. Membership forms may be obtained on the SASA website [www.showingsa.co.za](http://www.showingsa.co.za) or from [admin@showingsa.co.za](mailto:admin@showingsa.co.za). SAEF Day Membership fee R150. Once a rider has done more than two shows, then the rider must register online and become a full SAEF member. No temporary SASA membership will be allowed at this show
3. SASA will pay entry fees for SASA EDTS competitors in all classes. That includes In Hand and Under Saddle classes. The competitor must be an EDTS member of SASA. Membership is free. EDTS application forms, Rules and Conditions are available at [www.showingsa.co.za](http://www.showingsa.co.za) or from [admin@showingsa.co.za](mailto:admin@showingsa.co.za) EDTS competitors will earn EDTS Victor Ludorum points.
4. Working Hunters will be required to jump a course of approximately 6-8 fences, one of which will be a combination.

5. Should a competitor qualify more than one horse for the championship, he may nominate another rider, who must be a paid-up member of SASA, to show the horse in that championship. However, the competitor must do the individual test required in the Championship.
6. The Organising Committee, in consultation with the SASA Representative, reserves the right to cancel or combine classes.
7. All classes will be run under SASA Rules – 21<sup>st</sup> Edition (Effective 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2020).
8. EVERY COMPETITOR ENTERING THIS SHOW DOES HEREBY INDEMNIFY ANY JUDGE REGISTERED WITH SASA, OFFICIATING AT THIS SHOW, AGAINST ANY CLAIM OF ANY NATURE FROM ANY CAUSE WHATSOEVER.
9. Registered SASA Instructors will earn Victor Ludorum points for pupils.
10. Junior Horses will not be ridden by the Judge, due to Covid 19 restrictions.
11. Heights of Horses must be stated on entry forms and in Horses passport.
12. The minimum age of horses shown under saddle shall be 3 years.
13. 59.2.1 All competitors, owners and sponsors shall be registered with a club in whose area of jurisdiction they have their principal place of residence, SAEF and SASA and shall be re-registered on 1 January each year. Membership forms may be obtained on the SASA website [www.showingsa.co.za](http://www.showingsa.co.za) or from [admin@showingsa.co.za](mailto:admin@showingsa.co.za)
14. **Horses shall be registered with SAEF and SASA**
15. **The horse and rider combination will compete as a member of the Province where the rider is resident.**
16. On no account, and under penalty of disqualification, may any horse take part in any of the showing classes if the horse has been ridden by anyone other than the competitor from the first day of the show.
17. A deposit of R20 for a number is included in the entry fee. This is refundable to all competitors on condition that the number is returned before the end of the show. Entry fees are not refundable.

## **COVID 19 REGULATIONS & INDEMNITY**

**PLEASE NOTE THAT ALL SHOWING EVENTS WILL BE HELD UNDER THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS & INDEMNITIES AS PER SAEF GOVERNMENT SUBMISSION – 1 JULY 2020**

**Neither SASA nor any Showing Council accept any responsibility /liability for any Judge, Competitor, Show Official, groom, parent, driver that might contract Covid-19 at any Showing show. All entries are done so at your own risk.**

**This document must be read in conjunction with the SAEF Sport Ready, Safe Sport Resumption Covid-19 Document. All Show Holding Bodies must comply with the Government Gazette and approved SAEF sport ready document.**

1. All competitors, judges and officials must be members of SAEF.
2. All riders, judges, officials, support staff & medics agree & confirm that they will comply with the South African Government Regulations & SAEF Covid-19 guidelines & protocols, as issued by SAEF and set out on the SAEF website [www.saeef.org.za](http://www.saeef.org.za) , when entering a show/event.
3. Riders may only be accompanied by their groom & a driver (only if needed). The driver of the vehicle must remain in /or near the vehicle for the duration of the show. Junior & Pony Riders (18 years & under) may be accompanied by one parent or guardian. Note that the maximum number of individuals permitted at any show/ venue, will be determined by the schedule supplied by SAEF for each registered venue.

**NO SPECTATORS ARE ALLOWED & STRICT SOCIAL DISTANCING WILL BE ENFORCED.**

4. All present at the Event will be required to report to the official Covid-19 Compliance Officer on arrival. This includes grooms, parents & riders. The register will be signed, Temperatures will be taken & recorded, Hand sanitizer will be provided. Only screening (taking of temperatures) is required, not testing (as in a Covid-19 official test). All individuals must complete and submit the SAEF Covid-19 Self Screening questionnaire and hand it over to the Covid-19 Compliance officer.
5. The name of the relevant Covid-19 Compliance Officer will be published on the entry form.
6. It is **COMPULSORY** for all present to wear face masks/covering, correctly positioned, at all times.

7. Riders do not have to wear masks in the warm-up arena and may compete without a mask. On Completion of the class/round, riders must return to their parking spot to untack, load and vacate the venue as soon as possible. A cool down period of 15 minutes is allowed, and the rider should then leave the premises as soon as possible afterwards.
8. Horseboxes & vehicles must adhere to the regulatory distance of 5m (five meters) apart, in demarcated parking areas.
9. No prize-giving will be held. All prize money will be paid electronically. A record of prize winners will be kept. Results will be posted online or provided by e mail. Rosettes may be placed in a designated area clearly marked for the riders' attention.  
These may be collected by Riders, who are cautioned to wear masks and adhere to strict social distancing guidelines.  
The designated area must be provided with hand sanitizer for recipients to use.  
Riders are also requested not to gather at the collection point.
10. Horses will not be ridden by judges. Horses/Ponies may not be stripped for the Conformation phase of the class.  
No outside assistance will be permitted in the ring at any time.  
When lined up, competitors must maintain a 3.5-metre distance between each other.
11. Note that it is the Covid-19 Compliance officer's duty to determine how many competitors will be allowed to compete at a show. Any relevant Covid-19 restrictions pertaining to this, will need to be adhered to.
12. The Show holding body and venue has taken all & every precaution, ensuring Covid-19 compliance.  
Please note however that the Show Holding Body (Venue), SASA & the South African Equestrian Federation (SAEF) cannot be held responsible for any person contracting Covid-19 at the respective venues. All attendees enter the venue at their own risk.  
All competitors participate at their own risk. Note that SAEF Insurance will not cover anyone, should a person contract Covid-19 whilst attending/participating in a show, hosted by the approved Show Holding Body.
13. The venue's appointed Covid-19 Compliance Officer is authorized to ask any person/ attendant at the venue to leave immediately, should any of the Covid-19 regulations be contravened. No refunds will be given for entries, levies or any other costs incurred.
14. Catering may be available, provided correct Covid-19 Rules are adhered to.

### **Procedures to be adopted for Judging of Different Classes**

#### **Judging of Showing Classes**

1. All showing classes will be run under SASA Showing Rules Edition 21 Revised 3 February 2020. (Note that due to certain Covid-19 related restrictions, the points listed below, will take preference over the existing Rules.)
2. In all Showing classes, In Hand classes, SASA Riding Horse Classes, there shall be no more than 8 Competitors in the arena at any given stage.
3. This applies to the designated warm up arena as well.
4. In the event that there are more than two pools in a class and that there needs to be a Championship class run, then the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> placed winners will go forward to the Championship.
5. Riders must not congregate at the entrance to the arena and must maintain the required 3.5m distance. During the Go around, riders must maintain the minimum of 3.5m distance from the horse in front of them at all times.
6. Competitors must be lined up with a minimum of 3.5m distance between them.
7. There will be no ride by the Judge in any of the Classes.
8. The Conformation phase for Ridden classes will be done mounted. No Outside assistance is permitted in the ring.



9. The showing classes will remain with a maximum of 8 horses per pool.
10. There are no restrictions on the number of pools in a showing Class, provided that it fits in With the maximum number allowed at the specific venue, which is determined by SAEF for that particular venue. (E.g. A show Hack class can have 2 /3 Or 4 pools.)
11. The pools will be still be run as a normal class, with the exception of no Ride by the judge and exhibits will not be stripped for the Conformation phase of the class. (Unless it is an In Hand Class)
12. The same judge must judge all pools within a particular Class.
13. On completion of the judging of the pool, Judges will call into line the competitors, lining them up in an order of 1 to 8 or part thereof. No Prizes/Rosettes are awarded.
14. Once all pools of a specific class have been completed, then only, the combinations which were pulled in 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> in each of the relevant pools, will go forward to a separate class. This class must take place straight after the qualifying pools. (It is unlikely that there would be more than 4 pools of horses/Ponies, so, this class would still not exceed the maximum number of 8 competitors allowed in the ring at once.)
15. Horses/Ponies will only do the go around phase in this class. No Test or conformation phase will be done.
16. The judge will then call them in order of preference, and this will be the final result of the class 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> for two pools. 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> for 3 pools and so on.
17. These prize winners will receive rosettes and points as per what is stipulated in the SASA rules. As per Rule 50.9.2 (No Rosettes/prizemoney are handed out to competitors and judges must still maintain distance when congratulating competitors.)
18. Where there is only one pool of Horses/Ponies then the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> will be placed and receive points as per Rule 50.9.3 and it will not be necessary to hold a separate class.
19. In Novice Classes, points will be awarded as per Rule 52.2.2.

### **Judging of Working Hunter Classes**

1. Competitors may walk the course. Pony riders and Juniors may be Accompanied by one person. Masks must be worn whilst walking and social distancing must be adhered to.
2. After each class, the jumps /uprights that have been handled to adjust heights for the different classes will need to be sanitized prior to the commencement of the following class.
3. Competitors will enter the arena one at a time, to jump their round. They will then leave the arena to remove the horses boots and immediately return mounted to complete their Conformation Phase.
4. There will be no ride by the judge.
5. There will be no pools in this class.

### **Judging of Working Riding Classes.**

1. Competitors working Riding Tests will be placed on a suitable Notice board at the show arena prior to the start of the class.
2. Competitors will enter the arena one at a time to do their test. On completion of their test, they will remain in the arena to do their conformation phase, mounted. There will be no ride by the judge.
3. Where possible, there should preferably not be any objects that need to be picked up /handled by the competitor during the test. If, however, this is incorporated, the item must be sanitized after each competitor has completed that movement.

4. There will be no pools in this class.

No prize-giving will be held after any of the classes held on the day at the show.

Any prize money will be paid electronically. A record of prize winners will be kept. Results will be posted online or provided by e mail.
